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# Barnyard II

Finished Size: 52" x 66"

All seam allowances are 1/4". Read all directions before beginning. Press all seams as you sew.

## Fabric Requirements:

**Fabric A:** 1/3 yd. of 5674 Grass  
**Fabric B:** 1/3 yd. of 5674 Straw  
**Fabric C:** 1/3 yd. of 5118 White  
**Fabric D:** 1/3 yd. of 5120 Pink  
**Fabric E:** 1/3 yd. of 5672 Gray  
**Fabric F:** 1/3 yd. of 5671 Brown

**Fabric G:** 3/4 yd. or two complete stripes of 5670 Multi  
**Fabric H:** Directional: 2-1/8 yds. of 5670 Multi or Non-Directional: 1 yd.  
**Fabric I:** 1-1/4 yds. of 5122 Black  
**Fabric J:** Directional: 1-1/2 yds. of 5122 Red or Non-Directional: 1/3 yd.  
**Backing:** 4-1/4 yards of BTR-5673 Multi

Fabrics H and J are shown in the quilt with the fabrics cut directional following the print. This uses more fabric and has some waste. We have included the yardage if you choose to cut the fabric non-directional which would still look good and uses less fabric.

**NOTE:** Fabric I is also directional but the yardage is almost the same either way you cut it. So no additional instructions were needed.

## Cutting Directions:

**Fabric A:** Cut twenty-four 3-1/2" squares.  
**Fabric B:** Cut twenty-four 3-1/2" squares.  
**Fabric C:** Cut three 8-1/2" squares.  
**Fabric D:** Cut three 8-1/2" squares.  
**Fabric E:** Cut three 8-1/2" squares.  
**Fabric F:** Cut three 8-1/2" squares.  
**Fabric G:** Fussy cut two 10-1/2" x 38-1/2" strips centering each on the main stripe  
**Fabric H:** Cut three 4-1/2" x width of fabric strips. Piece them together to make two 4-1/2" x 52-1/2" strips for the top and bottom outer border.  
Directional: Cut two 4-1/2" x 58-1/2" from the length of fabric (LOF) for the side borders.  
Non-Directional: Cut three 4-1/2" x WOF strips and piece them together to make two 4-1/2" x 58-1/2" strips for the side borders.

**Fabric I:** Cut six 2-1/2" x 42-1/2" strips from the LOF for the horizontal sashing. Cut six 6-1/2" x LOF strips for the binding. Cut fifteen 2-1/2" wide x 8-1/2" high strips and four 2-1/2" wide x 10-1/2" high strips from the remaining fabric for the vertical sashing.

**Fabric J:** Cut three 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together to make two 1-1/2" x 56-1/2" strips for the inner side borders. Directional: Cut two 1-1/2" x 44-1/2" from the length of fabric (LOF) for the top and bottom inner borders. Non-Directional: Cut three 1-1/2" x WOF strips and piece them together to make two 1-1/2" x 44-1/2" strips for the top and bottom inner borders.

**Backing:** Cut two 74" x WOF strips. Piece them together to make the 60" x 74" backing.

## Assembly Directions:

- To make one Cow block, place one 3-1/2" Fabric A square to the top left corner of one 8-1/2" Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric 1/4" from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.
- Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 3-1/2" Fabric A square to each of the remaining corners of the Fabric C square to make one Cow block. Repeat to make three Cow blocks total.
- Repeat Steps 1 and 2 with the remaining 3-1/2" Fabric A squares and three 8-1/2" Fabric E squares to make three sheep squares.
- Repeat Steps 1 and 2 with twenty-four 3-1/2" Fabric B squares, three 8-1/2" Fabric D squares, and three 8-1/2" Fabric F squares to make three Pig Blocks and three Horse blocks.
- Refer to the quilt photo for block placement. Starting and ending with one 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric I strip, sew together four animal blocks and five 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric I strips, alternating them, to make one pieced block row. Repeat to make three pieced block rows total. Set aside.
- Sew one 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" Fabric I strip to each end of two 10-1/2" x 38-1/2" Fabric G strips to make two farm stripe rows.
- Refer to the quilt photo, to sew together six 2-1/2" x 42-1/2" Fabric I strips, two farm stripe rows and three pieced block rows to make the quilt top.
- Sew one 1-1/2" x 56-1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 1-1/2" x 44-1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- Sew one 4-1/2" x 58-1/2" Fabric H strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 4-1/2" x 52-1/2" Fabric H strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- Layer, quilt and bind as desired.






